Along with bass player Bill Black, the triorecorded an old blues number called "That's All Right, Mama." He then became a fairground barker, working sideshows with a zeal for small-scale huckstering and the casual scam that never left him. Even at his most famous, Elvis was still being booked to play out-of-the-way towns in North Carolina because the former fairground barker (who shamelessly negotiated as such even with top record company and film executives) knew them from his days on the circus circuit. And Elvis was trapped playing years of arduous seasons in
