

## Thesis Guidelines

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Each thesis or dissertation is unique but all share several common elements. The following is not an exact guide but rather a general outline. Chapter 1: Purpose and Significance of the Study. In the first chapter, clearly state what the purpose of the study is and explain the study's significance.

The thesis supervisor must be a full-time faculty member at AUC. Having a thesis co-supervisor must be mutually agreed upon by the student and the main thesis supervisor

In form, the thesis is a lengthy experimental, design, or theoretical report, with a problem - method - results - discussion structure. This recurrent hypothetico-deductive pattern of developing a thesis to solve a problem and then constructing a methodology and testing for results is common in research writing.

Features that should stand out in the thesis include the quality of the scholarship or research, the soundness of the logic, the originality of ideas, and the lucidity of the prose, but not the size of the headlines. The use of headers or chapter titles larger than 3/16" is discouraged and the use of excessive italics or bold print is discouraged.
